**AREA MAIL PROCESSING (AMP) FEASIBILITY STUDY
Glenwood Springs, CO CSMPC to Grand Junction, CO P&DF**

April 22, 2011

Area Mail Processing (AMP) is the consolidation of mail processing operations from one or more postal facilities to other facilities to improve operational efficiency and/or service.

An AMP study was initiated to evaluate the transfer of mail processing from the Glenwood Springs, CO Customer Service Mail Processing Center (CSMPC) to the Grand Junction, CO Processing and Distribution Facility (P&DF). The initial results of the study support the business case for consolidation. This study, currently in review at United States Postal Service Headquarters and its Area Office, is subject to change.

A public meeting will be held to share the initial results of the study and allow members of the community to ask questions and provide feedback. The public's input will be considered prior to a final decision.

The meeting will be held on Monday, May 9, 2011, at Glenwood Springs High School, 1521 Grand Avenue, Glenwood Springs, CO 81631 at 6:00 p.m. Below are preliminary highlights from the study:

1. Business Case

Proposed annual savings in the draft AMP feasibility study are approximately \$1.2 million.

2. Postal Employees

Due to the consolidation, a net decrease of approximately 19 positions is projected. All reassignments will be made in accordance with collective bargaining agreements.

3. Local Customer Considerations

- Collection box pick-up times will not change as a result of the AMP.
- Retail services will remain the same.
- Business mail acceptance will remain the same.
- A local postmark will be available for stamped First-Class Mail.
- Delivery of mail to residences and businesses will not change as a result of the AMP.

4. Commercial Mailers

Mailers who presort mail will continue to receive appropriate postage discounts.
